

This is the story of a bee



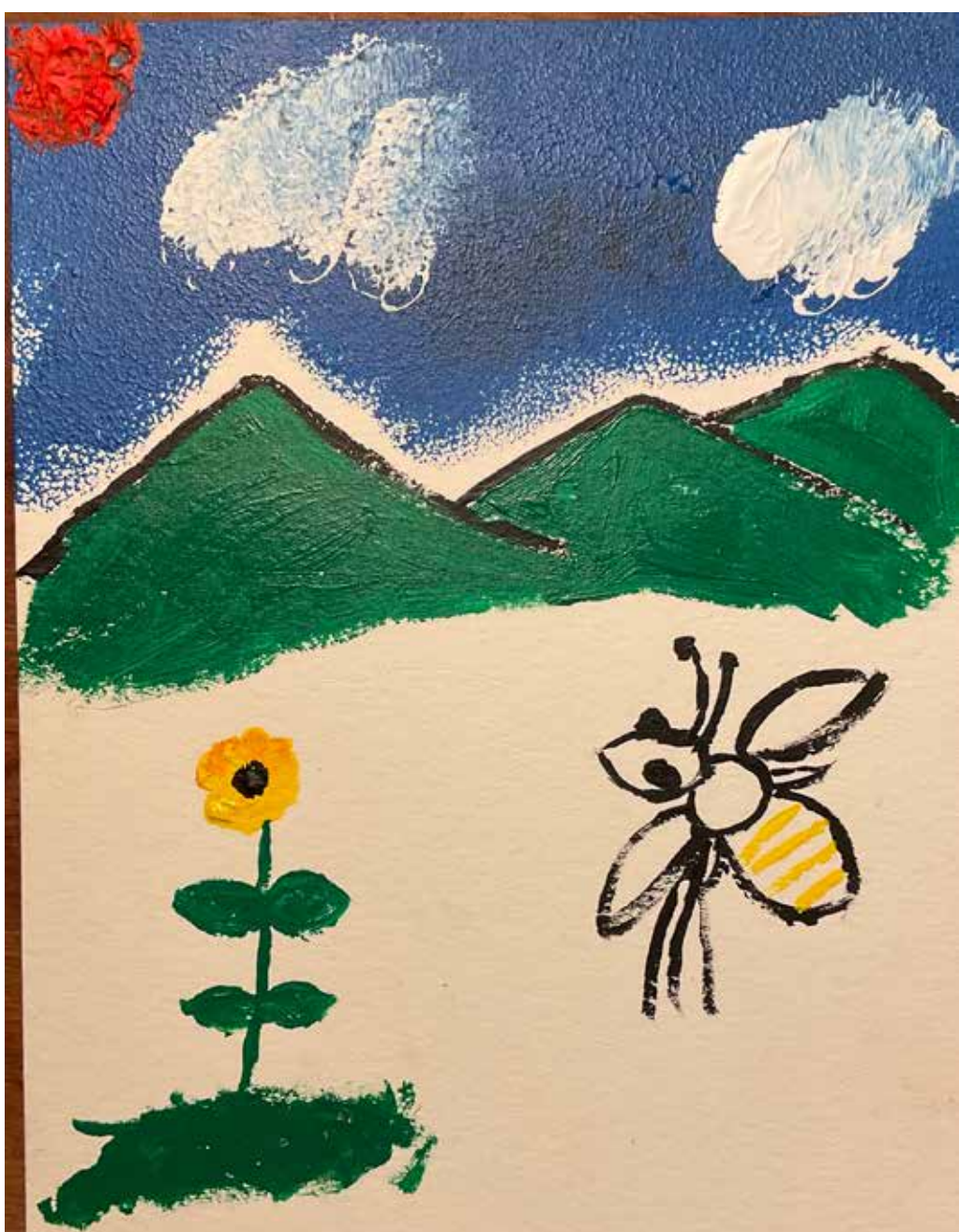
That was born

in a beehive

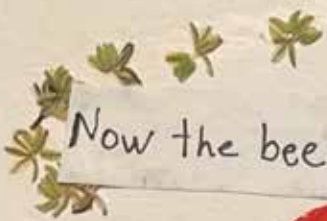
with other bees

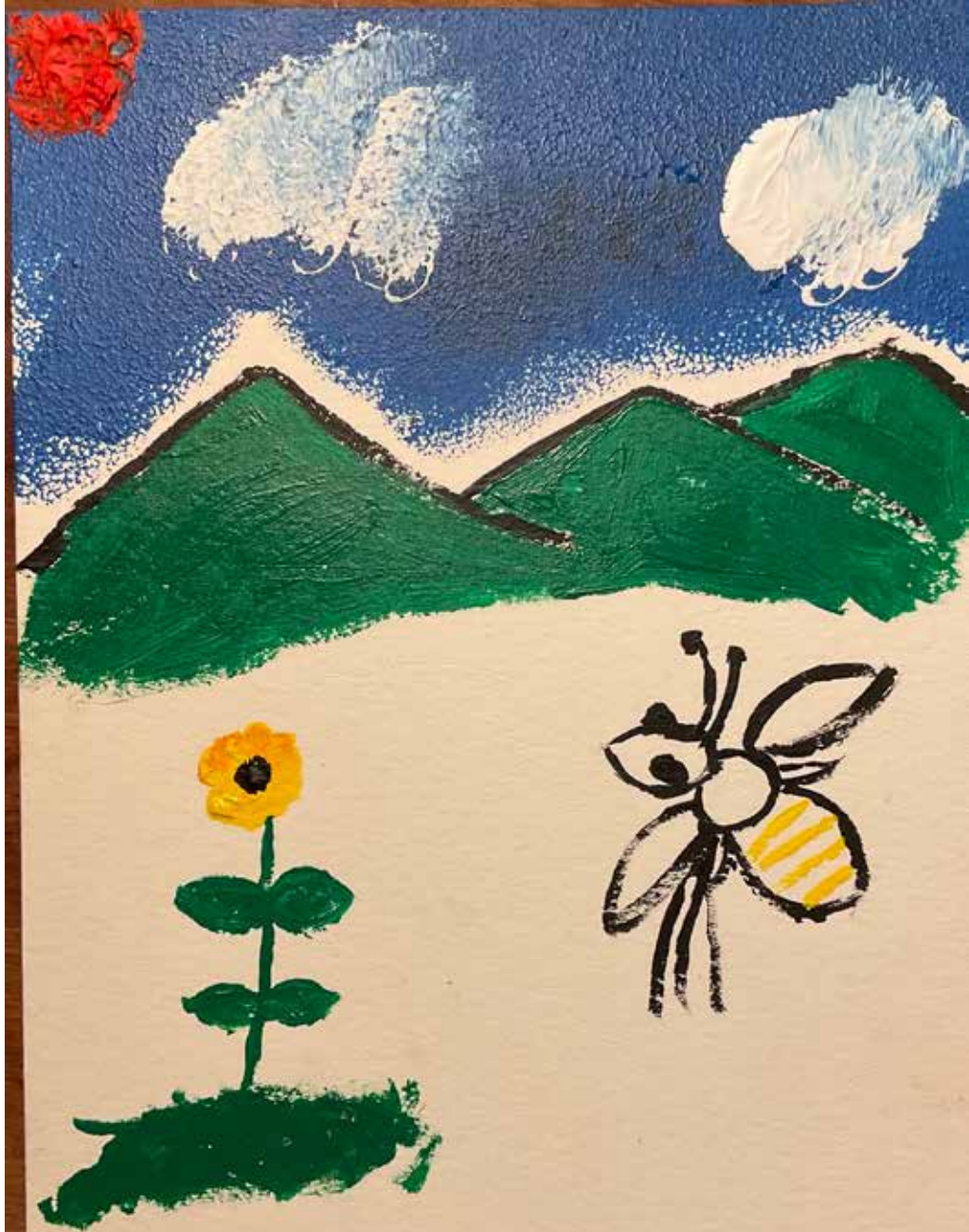


